Here are some of the things we did in third
 grade this week:

In religion, we went to Eucharistic Adoration on Tuesday. We enjoy this quiet time of reflection and having a conversation with Jesus. We began our next chapter that God calls us to holiness. God calls each of us at our baptism. The mission we are committed to by our Baptism is to love and serve God and one another. We learned that every baptized person has a vocation to love and serve God in a specific way and for each of us; it is different - single or married people, religious brothers or sisters, or priests or deacons.

In math, we continued our unit on fractions. We learned about comparing fractions with the same denominator and numerator. We used different
