

We had another busy and wonderful week in third grade. On Tuesday we enjoyed the beautiful weather while at the Fremont Township Garden! We planeted potatoes, brussel sprouts and lettuce. We also picked spinach, dill and trasnplated some flowers. On Thursday we enjoyed the afternoon sunshine while we had our picnic lunch on the front lawn. At our spring concert, the kids did a fantastic job! I am impressed on how well they did with their recorders.

Here are some of the things we did in third grade this week:

In religion, we discussed that we gather together to praise God. We learned that the Introductory Rites are the first part of the mass from the gathering song until we listen to God's word. Then we proceed into the Liturgy of the Word where we listen and respond to God's Word. We discussed how the first reading and psalm are from the Old Testament and the second reading and gospel is from the New Testament. Following the Liturgy of the Word begins the Liturgy of the Eucharist when the bread and wine become the Body and Blood of Christ.

In math, we learned about fact families (related facts) earlier this week. We know that multiplication and division are inverse operations too! We also learned the rules for dividing with I and 0. Students are able to divide by 2 and IO! I'm so amazed on how well they have picked up division and the strategies we can use.

In science we learned the difference between an animal cell and a plant cell. Plant cells have chloroplast (to make their food) and a cell wall - neither of which an animal cell has. We also discussed the needs of plants - sunlight, water, minerals and air. With this, we were able to make a great connection to our time volunteering at the garden to see the needs of plants.

In language arts, we have continued our novel study on <u>Charlotte's Web</u>. We began reading chapters I6, I7, and I8. It was time to take Wilbur to the county fair, but only after he had a buttermilk bath to sparkle. Charlotte was able to convince Templeton to go to the fair by telling him about all the leftover food he could find - what rat wouldn't love that! Our spelling pattern for the week was words with various endings -er, -al, -le, -ar, and -or. Next week will be our last week of spelling.
